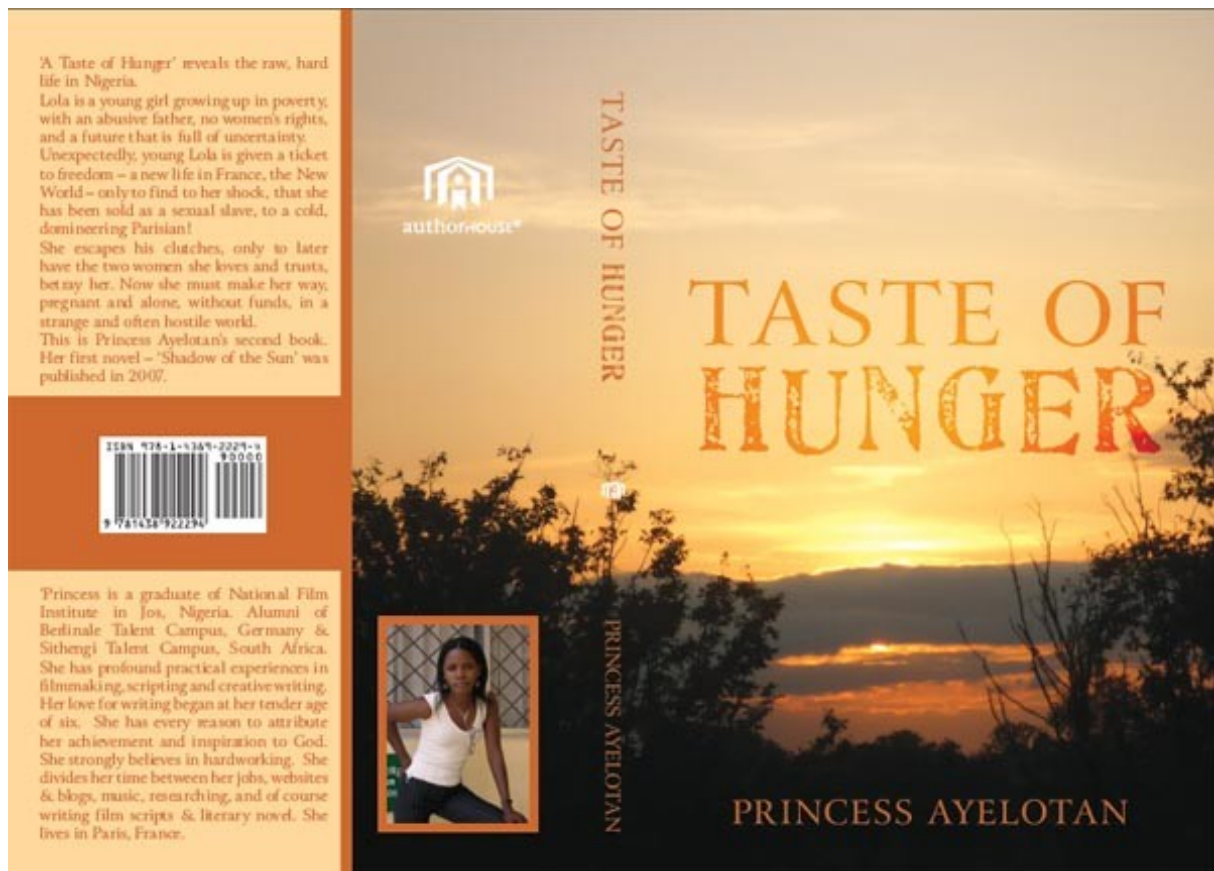


## Taste of Hunger

With profound experiences that bring back memories of absolute servitude Princess succeeds in jolting the reader bringing him face to face with issues that no longer can be ignored: tyranny and slavery still exist in the world.

Women form the cornerstone of her oeuvre and the 'Taste of Hunger' is Princess's second book which celebrates a woman's fight against punitive and discriminatory laws and her determination and will to win...come what may.
